Our operational start-up date is September 1, 1982. I have been involved in project fund raising with two major Christian Relief and Development organizations and will employ similar methods here. Our staff will also have a significant background in grantsmanship.

Up to this point, most of our fund raising activities have been by word of mouth. But since we are opening our office on September 1, 1982, we are about to gear up our fund raising. We will be using direct mail, media, church presentations, and will also submit proposals for grants and contracts to private voluntary organizations. We will be renting mailing lists, placing ads in magazines, and be developing projects that others will fund.

As of September 1982, we will begin full operation of fund raising and program activities. We will be recruiting professional men and women to work in relief and development projects in the Third World. Their operations will be in conjunction with local Christian organizations or missions.

We will also be appealing to the Christian public to support these and other projects overseas.

A seminar on Christian vocations is being developed for churches throughout the United States. This seminar will be used as a recruitment vehicle for Christian professionals. Once these people are recruited, they will participate in a cross-cultural orientation program which includes practical experience in the greater Seattle area. Then they will move overseas where they will use their skills to help others, and at the same time build up the local churches. The projects they will be involved in include community health, vocational training, agriculture, and emergency relief.
